
JSTOR is a full-text digital archive of major scholarly journals, selected book chapters, and primary source materials (such as conference proceedings, society publications, or pamphlets).

Subjects include: area studies; arts; business and economics; history; humanities; law; medicine; science and mathematics; and social sciences.

Most journals are available from the very first volume up to the most recent 2-5 years. Updated regularly.

HOW

- 1 Go to www.torontopubliclibrary.ca and enter “jstor” in the search box.



- 2 Click “Access Online”
- 3 Enter your library card number and PIN

SEARCH

Enter search terms in the **BASIC SEARCH** box on the main page to search all content in all disciplines.






