What freedoms are at risk when we challenge Intellectual Freedom? What's at stake?

- Individuals and institutions in society are facing increasing intellectual freedom challenges on a wide range of issues, through all forms of media, and from all sides of the political and social spectrum.
- As a result of these challenges, our access to information is slowly being narrowed, affecting so many aspects of our lives: our social networks, work, class structures, education, how we see each other, our civil liberties, democracy!
- How can we understand these forces and how they are shaping and impacting our lives? How can we defend against these challenges and protect our access to free thought, ideas and information?

These are some of the most critical conversations of our time.

The library is uniquely positioned to have these conversations.

 - Library staff-focused events
